

Bee Keeping: Intermediate - GLNA2641

- The collection of food and other resources
- Significant forage species of southern Vancouver Island
- Reproduction, swarming and supersedure
- Queen production and mating
- Seasonal considerations for maximizing colonies
- Spring/Summer and Fall/Winter
- Supering for maximum honey production
- Crop removal, processing, packaging and marketing
- Pollination and other specialized beekeeping sidelines
- Disease and pest management strategies
- Injury to bees from pesticides
